KENOSHA – The Snow Daze Festival returns for the eighth year – after taking a pandemic related break in 2021 – from 1-4 p.m. Saturday, February 5 at Veterans Memorial Park outside City Hall, 625 52nd St. Look for lots of fun photo opportunities, with more than 40 ice sculptures on display in the park and in front of downtown businesses. While ice sculptures have a variety of shapes, sizes and themes, the overall event theme this year is Candyland.

Watch as ice artists from Art Below Zero in Franksville create a one-of-a-kind ice sculpture, beginning at 1 p.m. in Veterans Memorial Park. Herzing University will hand out free candy to the first 1,000 kids who visit the sculpture carving demonstrations and sculptures on display at the park.

Take a spin on the City's ice rink at Veterans Memorial Park, and enjoy free skate check-outs sponsored by the Mayor's Youth Commission.

Snow Daze is presented by the City of Kenosha and Visit Kenosha with support from area businesses and the Lakeshore Business Improvement District. Look for deals and special offers at downtown businesses.
