WANTED FOR HOMICIDE



29-YEAR-OLD Kendal T. Readus.

If you know where Readus is call 911. Do not approach Readus or attempt to apprehend him yourself. Readus is considered armed and dangerous. September 28, 2022

Today, the Kenosha Police Department confirms that Houston R. Oliver, a 33-year-old resident of Kenosha and James J. Alexander-Hood, a 35-year-old resident of Racine, were killed in the shooting at Las Margaritas, on September 18, 2022. Two additional gunshot victims, who will remain unidentified, had serious but non-life-threatening injuries. They have since been released from area hospitals.

This investigation remains very active and no suspects are in custody at this time. If you have information, we urge you to cooperate and speak with our investigators.
