KENOSHA – High School students have an opportunity to become involved in the election process, while working for the City of Kenosha as volunteer election inspectors for the Spring Election and Presidential Preference Primary Tuesday, April 5.

Volunteers must be 16 or 17 years old and have a 3.0 grade point average or equivalent. They must be enrolled in grades 9 to 12 in a public or private school; and must be a U.S. citizen and a resident of the city of Kenosha.

This is a great opportunity for students to compliment their civics education, and also satisfy community service requirements.

Students will receive a high school student election inspector package including a t-shirt and lanyard with name tag attached, both required to be worn on election day.

Students have a choice of various shifts on election day between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. and are encouraged to bring a snack and drink. Friends can work together and will be assigned to the same polling location.
