KENOSHA- Original music and cover songs in genres ranging from jazz to pop, rock, alternative and blues fills the air each Tuesday evening through the end of August at the Pennoyer Park Bandshell.

Tuesdays at the Shell is a free outdoor concert series presented by MAAM, Happenings Magazine and The City of Kenosha. The musical acts were selected from the membership of the local non-profit Musicians Assisting Advancing Musicians.

The concert series is held on Tuesday evenings at the Sesquicentennial Bandshell at Pennoyer Park, 3601 Seventh Avenue in Kenosha.

Upcoming performances include:

July 21st (6:00-8:00)- Rude Rooster's four-man band loves to rock. Expect an aggressive rock and roll style.

July 28th (6:00-8:00)- Disregarded Stars, from Waukegan, plays mostly original songs along with a few covers with a mix of country, rock and Americana.

August 4th- (6:00-6:50) Gentle Lia, a duo acoustic band, ranges in genre from jazz to rock.

August 4th- (7:10-8:00) Real Deal's versatile ensemble features pop, rock, jazz, blues, funk and soul.

August 11th- (6:00-6:50) David's Bazaar, a veteran solo vocal-and-acoustic-guitar act, offers up a hodgepodge of musical wares, from the '50s to 2015. Expect to hear rock, pop, folk and country, from the uptempo sing-along to the deliciously atmospheric.

August 11th-(7:10-8:00) Matt Haeffel's music is often compared to Van Morrison, Paul Simon and Dave Mathews—artists with uneasily defined niches.

August 18th (6:00-8:00)- Three Left-plays straight forward metal and rock music.

August 25th- (6:00-6:50) Pierce Vendetta & Rick offers acoustic remakes of popular songs and their own original music. The majority of their songs are performed using guitar and percussion with versatile and emotive vocals.

August 25th- (7:10-8:00) The Send Help Band Reunion- Candy Eisenhauer and Bill Switzer

joined forces in the early 70's under various band names and added Dave Picollo in the early 80's. The band retired in 2013 but with the addition of Willi Sterba and Brennan Pierce they are performing one last reunion show. The Send Help Band sounds like Janis Joplin, Bonnie Raitt, The Doobie Brothers, Journey and Pat Benatar.
