KENOSHA – The City of Kenosha will offer an opportunity for residents to shred documents at three city locations from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 6. Shredding will be offered outside in the parking lot at the Southwest Library, 7979 38<sup>th</sup> Ave.; the Northside Library, 1500 27<sup>th</sup> Ave., and at the Kenosha Regional Airport Terminal Building, 9900 52<sup>nd</sup> St.

The site at the Airport Terminal Building may be accessed via 52nd Street, entering the airport property on Ruth Harmon Drive. Proceed east until the dead end at the Terminal Building parking lot.

Kenosha residents are welcome to bring up to five bags or boxes of items to be shredded by Shred-It representatives.

The goal of the event is to destroy documents containing personal information, such as medical records or bills. It is not intended for junk mail, which may be disposed of with paper recycling items during regular curbside collection.

Paper, paper clips, staples, check books, receipts, notebooks are accepted for shredding. Binders, floppy discs, CDs and hard drives are among the items that are not accepted for shredding.
