Fire Department study complete

KENOSHA – As promised, Mayor Keith Bosman today released the final report of the fire department study conducted by the consultant, Baker Tilley. The study, which was requested by the Common Council during last year’s budget deliberations, has been part of recent political rumors and inaccuracies leveled against the Mayor by certain disgruntled Aldermen.

While the bottom line conclusion of the report indicates there is not a current need for additional firefighters, ambulances or fire stations at this time, the report makes specific recommendations for potential improvements to “what are already high levels of service” being provided to the community.

“Public safety is a top priority for the city of Kenosha,” Bosman said. “This study is helpful in examining our current fire department resources and will aid in planning for the future.”

Bosman said he plans to meet soon with fire department administration, representatives of Local 414 firefighters union and members of the Public Safety & Welfare Committee to review the study in depth. Bosman said he and city staff will reserve further comment on the study until after these meetings have taken place.
