Charles Bradley arrived shortly after role call.
2. Vice President Keeling made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held December 21, 2010. Secretary Frederick seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
3. Citizen's comments:

Steve Fredriksson of the Concerned Citizens Coalition presented an award to Police Officer John DeMario for his work with the coalition to increase community awareness of the problem of underage drinking.




Dear Chief Morrissey,






Kenosha Fire Chief John Thomsen,
