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## POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION

### MINUTES OF MEETING HELD JANUARY 19, 2010<sup>10</sup>

1. The regular Police & Fire Commission meeting was called to order by President Todd Ingrouille at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, January 19, 2010. The meeting was held in room 202 of the Municipal Office Building. On roll call, the following members of the Commission were present, President Ingrouille, Vice President Keeling, Secretary Frederick, Commissioner's Bradley and Greene.
2. Secretary Frederick made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held December 15, 2009. Vice President Keeling seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
3. Citizen's comments: None
4. Vice President Keeling made a motion to receive and file Police and Fire Department Reports for the month of December 2009. Commissioner Bradley seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
5. Vice President Keeling made a motion to receive and file Walworth County Sheriff David Grave's letter of thanks. Commissioner Greene seconded the motion and it was carried.
6. The commissioners discussed how to handle anonymous complaints received. There was some disagreement on the matter. But, two other commission members agreed with President Ingrouille who later stated that anonymous complaints/letters received will be shared with the commission members, but, will not be placed on the meeting agenda and no action will be taken.
7. Vice President Keeling made a motion to receive and file Fire Chief Thomsen's memo regarding Apparatus Operator Keith Watkin's resignation effective February 1, 2010. Secretary Frederick seconded the motion and it was carried.
8. The appointment of Scott B. Schumacher to Fire Lieutenant effective February 1, 2010 was approved on a motion made by Vice President Keeling, seconded by Secretary and carried unanimously.

Fire Chief Thomsen:
  - Acknowledged Scott Schumacher's family members in attendance at the meeting.
  - Indicated that Scott Schumacher is the first person to be promoted from the new Fire Lieutenant eligibility list.


Police Chief Morrissey:

- KPD calls exceeded 100,000 for the first time in 2009. The annual report, with additional detail will be available soon.
- One half of the Police Officer applicants that passed the written exam have completed the initial oral interview, 68 individuals passed this interview and 20 will proceed to the chief's interview beginning January 26<sup>th</sup>.
- Requested to schedule a special meeting in March (March 2<sup>nd</sup> was suggested) to review candidates for the three (3) open Police Officer positions. If the appointments can be approved in March, the candidates could start on April 1, 2010.





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## POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION MINUTES OF MEETING HELD MARCH 2, 2010



  - One (1) candidate for the position of Probationary Firefighter,


Secretary Frederick seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.


The Commission reconvened into open session at 9:09 a.m. on a motion made by Commissioner Bradly, seconded by Vice President Keeling and carried unanimously.





On February 9, 2010 Dispatch received a call of a female that was not conscious and not breathing. You both responded and arrived at the scene and determined that the victim was in fact not breathing and did not have a pulse. You administered cardiopulmonary resuscitation until you could properly employ your automated external defibrillator device.

You followed the directives of the AED and delivered a shock to attempt to restore the victim's proper heart rhythm. You then continued CPR until rescue personnel arrived. Rescue was then able to establish a slight pulse, which allowed the victim to be transported to the hospital.

I wanted to recognize your efforts in this case. Your actions exemplify what we expect from our Officers at these difficult, medical emergency type calls. You both utilized your training and the equipment provided to you to try and save this victims life. Your quick actions reflect positively on you individually and on our Department overall. You can be sure that your professional conduct was appreciated by both the victims' friends at the scene and by the responding Rescue personnel.



I am writing to commend one of our city's police officers. Between the late evening hours of January 4<sup>th</sup> and early hours of January 5<sup>th</sup>, my garage was burglarized and my car was entered. Taken were a snow blower, an MP3 player, a pair of dress boots and some spare change. I reported the crime early January 5<sup>th</sup> and Officer Luellen responded. Because snow on the ground was fresh the tracks were still visible from the theft. My father (a retired deputy) and Officer J. Luellen followed them. This action led to a locked garage several blocks away. Although someone was present they would not give permission to enter the garage.

When it was suspected the stolen merchandise was in the garage, a search warrant was requested. While waiting for the search warrant to arrive I was called by Officer J. Since the suspect was listening to the MP3 player, I believe this added attention to detail allowed the other items to be found and confiscated.

The response to my call was prompt and I was treated in a very professional and respectful manner. I want to extend my appreciation to Officer J. Luellen. I believe he demonstrated himself to be an exemplary officer and should be acknowledged for his actions.
