- Extended a "thank you" to both Kristine Fonk and Tom Glassman for their many years of service.


Police Chief Morrissey:


- Acknowledged Thomas Glassman's 25 years of service. The PD is losing an extremely talented individual.
- Mentioned that with Kristine Fonk's well deserved retirement, the PD is losing a "great cop".


9. Commissioners' Comments:

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
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
POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION MINUTES OF MEETING HELD MAY 28, 2010


The Commission reconvened into open session at 4:59 p.m. on a motion made by Secretary Frederick seconded by Commissioner Greene and carried unanimously.







Re: Alarm 2010-061011

Please find attached and below my account of the events regarding a recent motor vehicle collision. This alarm resulted in the management of two vehicles, a disruptive crowd, and four victims, two of whom were critically injured. I am exceptionally proud of my personnel and how they mitigated this event and will outline the actions of each company for your review. Thank you in advance for your consideration.

Alarm 61011 began with a dispatch for a MVC with entrapment. Excellence began here when Supervisor Lovell of KCCJS dispatched an extrication assignment with 2 ambulances. His call takers, noted below, had gathered information that caused him to relay to me the following:

- 2 vehicles
- One vehicle possibly in a house
- One person pinned under a car
- One PNB on the ground.

This caused me to immediately call Flight for Life, and have them land at our pre-designated landing zone #7 (Kenosha Job Center). An Incident Safety Officer and an additional Engine Company to manage the LZ were also called.

On arrival, Engine 2 with Captain Walton, AO Stein and FF Vogt went to work. Walton gave a size-up of the incident and established command on Main. He and his company triaged the pt's finding an unconscious man covered on the sidewalk, unconscious Peds under a car on the lawn and one patient sitting in an involved vehicle. After stabilizing the car on the lawn, he and his crew then began resuscitation on the pediatric pt as well as gathering medical equipment for the care of the other unconscious victim. The seated driver was told to remain in his car.

I arrived simultaneously with M3 and T3. I assumed command from Walton as M3 began to work on the Peds pt. T3 also continued this care with Walton now joining the rest of his crew with the adult so he would have the benefit of a paramedic. Seeing this patients condition (one who bystanders had covered and called dead when I arrived), I called a second helicopter and informed E3 they would need to accommodate two aircraft. Lt. Ruhle was assigned this task and took full control of the entire parking with AO Shales

and FF Wenger. M5 was then updated of their pt and his condition as well as the development that he too would be flown to a Level 1. Med 5 arrived shortly after this update and worked with E2 to stabilize the adult.

Pt conditions were relayed to both aircraft by command with all pertinent LZ information being addressed by E3.

Approximately 10 minutes after Med 5 arrived, both pts were ready for transport to the LZ. T3 was then reassigned to this effort with E2 remaining at the initial scene to protect the growing crowd and KPD from the danger of the vehicles and biohazards. During this time, Capt Walton and his crew also located the missing driver, assessed him, and completed all applicable medical paperwork for his and the other driver's refusal of care.

As the Med Units relocated to the LZ, the first aircraft was just arriving with the second having a 10 minute ETA. On the arrival of both Med Units, E3 had established an exact location for the ambulances as well as concerns for traffic entering the area. T3 secured the Southern entrance of the area with her crew spreading along the Western aspect to keep literally hundreds of bystanders off the pavement of the operational area. Continuous and aggressive vigilance on their part caused the LZ to remain surgically clear allowing both aircraft to safely land within 50 feet of each ambulance. Lt Ruhle organized this area to such an extent that each aircraft was landed nearest the pt it would transport. Additionally, an off-duty Chief Officer from another agency relayed to me that when E3 arrived, they left their apparatus and moved at "almost a running pace" across the parking lot clearing it of debris that might become a hazard on FFL arrival.

Once at the LZ, both M3 and 5 gave a final detailed report to each of their aircrafts. This communication was so exact regarding each pt that both aircrafts were only on the ground less than a total of 5 minutes before departing to Froedert.

After the transfers occurred, all companies with the exception of E2 immediately returned to service, some even responding to incidents before making their quarters. Later than evening, I found that Captain Sinnen had saved the socks of the Peds pt and washed them so the family could have them returned. It is this commitment and the other acts noted above that allowed the customers of 5 May to receive exceptional service.
