- It has been an honor to work with Peni Keeling. Her service on the commission is appreciated.







For consideration at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Awards Committee, I respectfully submit Apparatus Operator/Paramedic Paul Murphy for formal recognition for services performed as set forth in the following citation:

To wit: During his years of service to the fire department and, specifically, during the past three calendar years; AO Murphy has been an indispensable asset in the area of radio communication system operations. AO Murphy came to us with field experience in complex public safety radio system service and has formal education on the subject matter.

One can quickly define the small handful of critical links in a modern, professional fire department. Radio transmission and reception is certainly at the top of any such list. AO Murphy has distinguished himself as the department's leading expert in these areas. For the past several years, he has been the "go-to-guy" for a sometimes dizzying array of technical issues.

On a daily basis, all radio communication issues are routed to AO Murphy. Department email sent to him on his day off is routed to his Smart Phone. The 911 Dispatch Center has, on several occasions, contacted Murphy with their communications woes before they contact their contracted vendor in Milwaukee.

Murphy has transformed a small closet space at Station 4 into a radio repair and parts center. He has sought from the budget process, software and hardware that supports our radio and tone alert systems. He processes the intake of defective equipment, completes repairs, and maintains an inventory of spare parts. He is the single point of contact with

our radio vendor and other providers of support equipment. He performs all radio installations, frequency tuning, and programs and maintains the department tone alert system.

AO Murphy played a major role in the recently-completed P-25 radio project. This three-year effort involved every mobile and portable radio on the fire department. He was at the table as several public safety agencies planned their switch to the FCC required narrow-band radio transmission. His planning resulted in an orderly and efficient roll-out of new equipment, training for all department personnel, custom fabrication of quick-disconnect parts for future ease of repair, and the complete switchover of all KFD units in a single day.

Using CIP equipment he specified, Murphy re-tasked a KFD repeater unit to serve as a backup repeater for those occasions when the Joint Services Unit fails. His efforts allow us to power up our own unit and restore lost communications (using equipment at our fire station) within just a few minutes.

It should be noted that Murphy does not perform these technical tasks under the guise of a special assignment in the CBA. He has the talent and gladly uses it to provide better public service. We certainly are one of the few municipal fire departments to have such a talented and dedicated master technician on staff. The citizens we serve are also fortunate to have a KFD member who, through his direct efforts, have saved tens of thousands of dollars in costly radio repairs by having them done in-house rather than at the end of a brutal invoice from private communications companies.

AO Murphy's efforts have made a distinct and persistent positive impact on the fire department. His efforts reflect great credit upon himself and are in the highest traditions of the fire service.




Chief Morrissey,


