POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION  
MINUTES OF MEETING HELD JUNE 21, 2011

1. The regular Police & Fire Commission meeting was called to order by President Keeling at 7:48 a.m. on Tuesday, June 21, 2011. The meeting was held in room 202 of the Municipal Office Building. On roll call, commission members Peni Keeling, Ron Frederick, Helen Schumacher, Charles Bradley and James Greco were present.
2. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held May 17, 2011. Secretary Schumacher seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
3. Citizen's comments:  
  
Russell Beckman presented a packet of information to Commission President Keeling indicating it is a complaint against Police Chief Morrissey.
4. Vice President Frederick made a motion to receive and file Police and Fire Department Reports for the month of May, 2011. Secretary Schumacher seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
5. Vice President Frederick made a motion to receive and file Police Lieutenant Charles R. Hannes notification or retirement effective June 30, 2011. Commissioner Bradley seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
6. The motion to receive and file the summary of the investigation into the complaint of Paul Arendt was made by Secretary Schumacher, seconded by Vice President Frederick and carried unanimously.
7. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to receive and file notice of the Fire Department Years of Service Awards. Vice President Frederick seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
8. Vice President Frederick made a motion to receive and file the Fire Department's documentation of 2010 Exemplary Attendance. Secretary Schumacher seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
9. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to receive and file the Fire Department's summary of Awards and Commendations. Secretary Schumacher seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.
10. Commissioner Bradly made a motion to receive and file Fire Chief Thomsen's

notification of awards, citations and commendations presented to Fire Department employees for their actions at a January 11, 2011 structure fire. Secretary Schumacher seconded the motion and it was carried.



I am writing in regards to a complaint that I brought forth against Kenosha County Police Detective Mr. Peter Kalk # 384.

This complaint was brought forth through the Internal Affairs unit in Kenosha County. I spoke with a LT. Maccari, who took my complaint on March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2011, while I was incarcerated in the Kenosha County Jail.

During this interview with LT. Maccari I was advised that I would be notified of the outcome of my complaint.

At this point in time I have not received a response from LT. Maccari or the internal Affairs unit regarding my complaint.

I have sent multiple follow-up letters asking the status of my complaint and informing them of my transfer to Dodge Correctional Institution. My last attempt was May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2011 which was to no avail.

In Continuing, I feel that these allegations are serious and I have overwhelming evidence in documentation to support my position against Det. Kalk for perjury & misconduct.

My objective is to place this matter in the hands of someone who will investigate my allegations and hold Det. Kalk accountable for his actions. In due course I ask that I am notified of the outcome of my complaint. If there is any additional information needed, it will be provided upon request.

I feel that it is necessary to assure you that everything within my complaint is true & accurate to the best of my knowledge.

Please Acknowledge this Correspondence to Be A Formal Complaint Against A Yonkers County Police Detective Mr. Peter Falk #384. For misconduct and perjury.

The allegations are as follows:

On or about August 27, 2009, Detective Peter Falk #384 was assigned lead Detective to investigate a robbery/shooting. [Case No. 09-CF-1087]

Det. Falk was provided with information in regards to this crime from officers J. Krein & Y. Correa, that responded to the call and who had initially taken a statement from the victim. These officers reported the information they received from the victim to Det. Falk.

Their report contained a name and description of an assailant that the victim was familiar with and thereby able to identify with a degree of positivity.

[See Supplemental Reports By J. Krein & Y. Correa]

After receiving this information Det. Falk contacted the victim and conducted a photo array to identify his assailant.

During this photo array Det. Falk states that he observed the victim have an animated response to the picture of the person believed to be an assailant. The victim then stated he was "150% sure that the individual in the photo was a guy he knows by the name "Yuda."

The victim then stated that "Yuda" was one of three guys that robbed and shot him. Yuda was ID'd as Mr. Myles Washington.

This was the third time that the victim Mr. Duvall Coates, gave a consistent identification, with absolute certainty. [See Supplemental Report By Det. Peter Falk Dated 9/31/09]

Based on the victim's positive identification of Mr. Washington AKA Kuda, as an assailant and additional consistent information obtained from the victim, Det. Falk applied for a No-Knock Search Warrant.

In Det. Falk's affidavit to this warrant he states: "Coates, during that identification, was animated when he made his selection and advised that he was "150%" sure that Washington was 1) Kuda and 2) one of the males in the group that robbed/shot him."

This search warrant was signed by Judge Carl Greco on August 28<sup>th</sup>, 2009, and was carried out by Det. Falk. [See No-Knock Search Warrant By Det. Peter Falk]

On January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2011, during my trial Det. Falk testified that the victim never said that Washington AKA Kuda, was the person who robbed and shot him.

Det. Falk testified that the victim never said anything close to he was 150% sure that Kuda was his assailant.

Det. Falk also testified that the victim advised him that his assailant was either myself or Kuda but during the photo array he did not pick between the two as being his assailant.

[See Trial Transcripts January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2011 pg's 223, 256]


However, this is a contradiction to the reports that were produced by Det. Falk himself, and the other two officers who reported that the victim believed he saw Kuda, who the victim later identified with 150% certainty.

Det. Falk's affidavit along with his Supplemental Report, dated 8/31/09, shows that he deliberately made material false and misleading statements during my trial, while under oath.

In Conclusion, please be mindful that my decision to pursue this complaint against this Law Enforcement officer is in addition to the constitutional issues that I am pursuing upon appeal of my criminal conviction that has resulted from this perjury.

Mr. Peter Kalk has perjured himself against the court and against my citizenship by deliberately lying and/or malicious falsifying information under oath. As a citizen I bring forth Complaint.


