Location: 50th Avenue - 61st Street to 63rd Street, Gangler Park - 82nd Street approximately 200 ft west of 65th Avenue

Please be advised that the above referenced project has been satisfactorily completed by A.W. Oakes & Son, Inc., Racine, Wisconsin. This project consisted of the relaying of an existing CMP storm sewer in 50th Avenue along with extensive pavement repair, a temporary trench repair and storm sewer in Gangler Park.

It is recommended that this project be accepted in the final amount of \$162,935.27. Original contract amount was \$124,468.00 for the base bid plus \$12,870.00 for Alternate A (Temporary Trench Repair) and \$33,553.00 for Alternate B (Gangler Park Storm Sewer) plus \$9,109.00 for contingency for a total contract amount of \$180,000.00. Funding was from CIP Line Item SW-95-001.

Subject: ***INFORMATIONAL ITEM – Fishing in Detention Basins***

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Stormwater Utility Committee requested staff to investigate any safety and health issues relating to fishing in detention basins at the regular meeting on July 26, 2010. Staff contacted the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources stormwater management staff regarding these questions and they said that they would pose these questions to their Fish and Wildlife experts.

The DNR has an urban fishing stocking program and some of the ponds that they stock are stormwater ponds. The DNR Fish expert advises to look at the drainage area that the basin serves whether it is highly industrial or residential. The higher industrial areas may have more harmful pollutants in the water. It also depends on the type of fish that they are catching and eating. Fish on the lower end of the food chain such as bluegills will have low levels of exposure. In any case the DNR is advising that the fish be washed in clean water and eaten in moderation. In Kenosha there are five urban fishery detention basins. They are:

- Peorio
- St. Peter's
- Tirabassi
- Nash
- Anderson

In reviewing information online and posting the question with the Water Resource Committee at APWA there does not appear to be any advisements against or for these recreation uses in the state of Wisconsin. However, when more information is available it will be provided to the Committee.
