SUBJECT: Aldermanic Request for 4-Way Stop at 63rd Street and 37th Avenue. (District 11)


Alderman Nudo is requesting this 4-Way Stop on behalf of the residents of this area. Currently there is East/West Stop control on 63rd Street at 37th Avenue.

This intersection has good visibility other than a raised yard grade in the southwest quadrant of the intersection. However, given that there is stop control in the east/west direction, the sight hazard is eliminated. Additionally, there is only one reported accident in the last 3 years. A 4-way stop warrant requires at least 3 in one year.

Although staff recognizes the concerns raised by Alderman Nudo, we do not recommend approval of this request for reasons stated above.

SUBJECT: Aldermanic Request for 4-Way Stop at 68th Street and 38th Avenue. (District 11)

Alderman Nudo is requesting this 4-Way Stop on behalf of the residents of this area. Currently there is North/South Yield control on 38th Avenue at 68th Street.

This intersection has Poor visibility in 3 of the 4 quadrants with raised yard grades, buildings or landscaping. There are three accidents reported in the last three years, one of which took place in August of this year. Additionally, the east/west street is on a down hill gradient.

Since there appears to be some concerns at this intersection, staff is suggesting a 90 day trial for a 4-Way stop control at the above intersection.

SUBJECT: Previous Trial to Place a No Parking Standing or Stopping on the North Side of 77th Street between 5710 and 5700. (District 15)

This request has been on a trial as indicated with many complaints reported by Scamps Gymnastics as well as parents and patrons. Staff has received numerous emails and a petition (114 signatures) requesting the signs to be taken down (see attached).

As indicated in the original request to place the NP signs, there was a concern for the safety of the kids crossing 77th Street. Therefore the city attempted to minimize the crossing of children as much as possible to avoid conflicts. However, since there are no reported incidents in this area and there is a strong resistance by the parents who allow their children to cross, Staff recommends approval for the removal of the No Parking Standing of Stopping restriction at the above location.

Dear Mr. Risch

We are the parents and patrons of Scamps Gymnastics, 5711 77th Street, Kenosha WI and are voicing our opinion of the three No Parking, Stopping, Standing signs posted in front of Happy Turf Landscaping, directly across the street from Scamps.

In our opinion, these signs are completely unnecessary and put up purely at our expense. At peak times, the Scamps parking lot is totally full and the parking spots available in the street are necessary. Without them it is possible traffic will back up onto 77th Street from people backed up waiting to pull into the parking lot on a daily basis.

Most of Scamps activities happen after 4 pm so there is very little overlap in the hours of business with neighboring businesses. The current signs are forcing kids to be in the street longer and farther from Scamps where motorists may not be expecting them.

Additionally, Happy Turf trucks and cars are parked in the road in front of their operation in violation of the signs at random times during the day. It is our understanding no one should be parking in the posted area.

Several times a year Scamps hosts gymnastics meets as well. Without parking across the street it could theoretically push the cars up to 60th Avenue or into the neighboring businesses' parking lots.

This is a dead end street and the patrons of Scamps are the only ones being impacted by these signs. If there is any sort of concern regarding children crossing the street, there should be either some sort of pedestrian crossing signs or slow down signs or both. No parking signs do not solve any issue and truly force kids into the street in other areas.

Please take these signs down at the end of the 90 day trial period.

Mr. Risch,

I am writing in regards to the No Parking signs put up in front of Happy Turf. I understand the employees at Happy Turf are concerned that they cannot see the children crossing the street in their work trucks.

As a parent I appreciate their concern, however, I feel the placement of the signs causes rather than reduces a safety risk. The majority of the practices are held in the evening, long after the trucks have been parked for the evening, young gymnasts are escorted to and from their vehicles while older gymnasts are cautious when crossing the street. The placement of the no parking signs does not reduce the number of children crossing the street, it only moves their rides further away from the entrance of Scamps making it necessary for them to either walk in the street or cross between cars, decreasing the visibility for on coming traffic.

Conscientious drivers are aware of the presence of children in all situations, and use caution when driving regardless of vehicle size. Perhaps a better solution than the no parking signs would be a Caution Children Crossing or a designated cross walk.

My name is Mike Alexander. I am the father of a girl who attends Scamps Gymnastics 4 -5 times a week. I am one of the many people that are not happy about the 'No Parking' signs that were put up across the street from Scamps. The claim is that Happy Turf's trucks can't see the kids as they cross the street to cars parked on the other side of the street.

Since I'm sure you are getting a lot of these emails, let me get right to the points I want to make.

* Scamps is a very busy place and when dropping kids off, it is convenient to pull in front of the building to drop off and pick up your child instead of always pulling in the parking lot which is already busy enough with kids running through it. Adding even more cars will make the Scamps parking lot even busier and even more dangerous especially with cars backing out of parking spaces.

* Scamps busy time isn't until later in the day and into the evening when Happy Turf is getting ready to close for the day and most if not all of their trucks are already back. In the evening, Happy Turf is CLOSED, so the truck issue doesn't make any sense.

* If Happy Turf is truly concerned about the safety of the kids, then speed bumps is a better way of slowing down all of the cars and trucks driving down the street. There are a lot more cars driving down the street than trucks and they all drive too fast. That's much more dangerous to the kids than the trucks pulling out of a parking lot.


SUBJECT: Aldermanic Request to Designate North side 77th Street along 5710 and 5700 as No Parking Standing Stopping Any Time. (District 15)

Alderman Orth is requesting on behalf of the business at 5710 77th Street (Happy Turf) that the area as noted be designated as No Parking Standing Stopping. This request is to diminish the drop off/pick up area caused by the Scamps Facility on the south side of 77th Street. Pedestrians crossing the street and truck vehicles of the business are a safety concern. The street is 36 feet wide with parking on both sides of the street.

Staff suggests a trial along with some enforcement effort to discourage this safety concern; North side 77th Street starting from approximately 721 feet east of 60th Avenue and ending approximately 373 feet further east ending at 57th Avenue.
