Staff members in attendance were Ron Bursek and Mike Lemens.

It was moved by Alderman Juliana, seconded by Alderman Misner to approve minutes. Motion passed 6-0.

C-1 Award of Contract for Project 09-1027 Epoxy Pavement Markings School Zones (Citywide Locations) to Brickline, Inc., Madison, Wisconsin in the amount of \$50,000.00. **(All Districts)**

ORDINANCE NO. _____

TO CREATE SECTION 5.041 OF THE CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF KENOSHA, WISCONSIN, ENTITLED "HONORARY STREET SUBNAMES"

The Common Council of the City of Kenosha, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section One: Section 5.041 of the Code of General Ordinances for the City of Kenosha, Wisconsin, is hereby created as follows:

5.041 HONORARY STREET SUBNAMES

A. Definitions. The following terms shall have the meanings provided below:

1. **Petitioner.** "Petitioner" means the person, group, institution, organization or other entity that requests an honorary street subname.
2. **Street.** "Street" means every highway within the corporate limits of the City, except alleys.

B. Petition Procedure.

1. **Petition.** The Petitioners for an honorary street subname sign must utilize forms provided by the City for that purpose. A petition for an honorary street subname sign must be countersigned by the Mayor or an Alderperson of any District ~~that includes that specific portion of the street that is subject to a street subnaming petition~~, who thereby will be the sponsor of a Resolution to effectuate the street subnaming. The Petition, with countersignature, must be filed with the Office of the City Clerk/Treasurer. The City Clerk/Treasurer will not accept a petition for street subnaming unless Petitioner has included the fee to cover ~~manufacturing of the signs(s)~~, installation, maintenance for the possible three (3) years that the sign is in place, and administrative costs, which fee shall be as established by the Common Council, from time to time, by Resolution. Such fee is nonrefundable.

2. **Approval.** After the Petition and the related fee are filed with the City Clerk/Treasurer, if the petition is determined by the City Attorney to be in procedural and substantive compliance with the requirements of this Ordinance, the City Attorney shall prepare a Resolution for proposed action by the Common Council to effectuate such subnaming. The Resolution shall designate the times and places subnaming signs shall be placed. Once drafted by the City Attorney and approved by the sponsor, the Resolution shall be placed on the Common Council agenda for referral to the Public Works Committee and the City Plan Commission for recommendation. Approval of the Resolution may be by majority vote of those present unless either the Public Works Committee and the City Plan Commission recommend denial; if either the Public Works Committee or the City Plan Commission recommend denial, the Resolution may be approved only if two-thirds of the elected Common Council votes to approve.

C. Requirements/Criteria. Approval, installation and maintenance of the subnaming sign is subject

to the following requirements:

- 1. An honorary street subname shall not change the official name of any portion of the affected street.
- 2. Signs indicating an honorary street subname shall include the word "Honorary" prominently displayed before the honorary street subname.
- 3. Honorary street subname signs shall not use the same color scheme, font and/or size as official street name signs.
- 4. No person, group, institution, organization, event or other entity shall be honored by more than one (1) designation of an honorary street subname.
- 5. No portion of any street shall be designated with more than one (1) honorary street subname.

~~6. The length of the portion of the street subject to subnaming shall be determined by the Common Council in the exercise of its discretion, which length may be less than that requested on the petition, but in no event may it be greater than ten (10) City blocks.~~

~~6. 7. Honorary street subname signs shall be posted only at both ends of the street to be subnamed at the intersecting cross street(s), and no intersection shall include more than two (2) signs indicating an honorary street subname. Honorary street subnames shall not apply to any portion of a street longer than ten (10) City blocks.~~

D. Duration. No honorary street subname sign shall be in place for a period exceeding three (3) years from the date of ~~approval~~ ~~installation~~. The Common Council, upon recommendation from the City Plan Commission and Public Works Committee shall have the ability to authorize the removal of an honorary street subname when it is determined that such honorary street subname no longer is relevant to any person, group, institution, organization, event or other entity for which the honorary street subname was applied to.

E. Restriction. Honorary street subnames may not be of individuals unless deceased for a minimum period of three (3) years.

Section Two: This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage

and publication.

ANALYSIS:


- The applicant is proposing to split the existing lot at 7201 Green Bay Road into two lots.
- Lot #1 will include the existing building, which is used as a medical office.
- Lot #2 would be a vacant, developable lot of roughly four (4) acres.
- The lots are zoned IP Institutional Park and the *Corridor Land Use Plan* shows this site as Institutional.
- The Certified Survey Map has been sent to City departments for their review and their comments are included in the attached Resolution. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation also reviewed the application based on the STH 31 frontage.
- The Certified Survey Map generally complies with Chapter 17 of the Code of General Ordinances.

TO APPROVE A TWO-LOT CERTIFIED SURVEY MAP
Property located at 7201 Green Bay Road (Wood Place/Kenosha Medical)

BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Kenosha, Wisconsin, that a Certified Survey Map relating to one parcels located at 7201 Green Bay Road is herein and hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

1. Compliance with all applicable State, City and Federal Codes and Ordinances.
2. Payment of all applicable fees, including recording fees.
3. Payment of all taxes, special assessments and stormwater utility fees prior to recording. The Owner shall provide the City Clerk-Treasurer, a certificate from the County Treasurer, stating that there are no past-due real estate taxes or special assessments on the parcel of real estate which is being divided.
4. The Certified Survey Map shall be null and void if not recorded within six (6) months of approval by the Common Council.
5. A digital Copy of the Certified Survey Map shall be provided to the City prior to recording.
6. The major street setback shall be shown on the Certified Survey Map.
7. Include a note on the Certified Survey Map that states "Parcel 1 and Parcel 2 are restricted to one access point on each parcel to State Trunk Highway 31".
8. A Cross Access Easement shall be provided from the north line of Parcel 1 to the south line of Parcel 2.
9. The existing water and sanitary sewer mains running along STH 31 shall be encompassed in an Easement dedicated to the Kenosha Water Utility. The Easement shall be wide enough to provide a minimum of ten (10') feet between the centerline of the sanitary sewer and the east edge of the Easement.
10. Compliance with all the preceding conditions as a prerequisite for authorizing Mayor and City Clerk-Treasurer to sign the Certified Survey Map.







The City of Kenosha began offering a \$2 coupon per box or bundle of 10 biodegradable yardwaste bags on Monday, September 21, 2009.

City residents may receive up to four (4) coupons upon request at Public Works, City Clerk, and Kenosha Water Utility. The coupon is also available on the city's website and may be printed at home for use at Kenosha area retailers only. The coupons are not valid on previous purchases and only one coupon may be used to purchase each box or bundle of bags.


Records indicate, since September 21, City Clerk, Public Works and Kenosha Water Utility have distributed approximately 3,500 yardwaste bag coupons. An additional 800 coupons were provided to local aldermen for distribution. The yardwaste coupon page on the city's website has had 688 hits, and this is tantamount to printing of the coupon 688 times. During the four weeks that the yardwaste coupon was made available to the public, it would appear that nearly 5,000 coupons have been distributed.

Portion between Sheridan Road and 7th Avenue is complete, and traffic has been shifted to the new pavement. Contractor is working on curb and gutter, driveways and sidewalk repairs. Mainline paving will be later in the month. (3, 12, 13)
- Project #07-1110 Storm Water Utility** – Staff is working with Stand Associates, the engineering firm engaged to study storm sewers in the Forest Park area, and a public information meeting was held on Thursday, September 24, 2009. Staff is continuing plan review activities. Crews are repairing catch basins and installing drainage improvements. Staff held a second public information meeting regarding the River Crossing drainage way. (Citywide)
- Project #09-1208 Sidewalk and Curb and Gutter Repair** – [Mann Bros.] Work is in progress. (Citywide)
- Project #09-1213 Sidewalk Hazard Elimination [Safesteps]** Work is completed. (Citywide Parks)
- Project #08-1017 – Street Reconstruction Phase I (38th Street from !-94 to CTH S)** – [LaLonde] Mainline paving work is complete. Work on driveway approaches and lighting is in progress. Ditching and asphalt transition will done in a couple of weeks. (16)
- Project #09-1120 – 3500 Block 39th Avenue Detention Basin Renovation** – [Mann Bros.] Work is in progress. Excavation is about 90% completed, and the contractor has started spreading topsoil. Weather may become a factor. (10)
- Projects#091410 – Pool Drains and Heaters** – Staff is continuing to develop plans and specifications for compliance with new federal mandates. (6, 9)
- Project #09-1443 and 08-1443 – Bike Path Extensions** – Project is in design. (16)
- Project #09-1012 – Resurfacing Phase I** – [Payne & Dolan] Work is in complete. (7)
- Project #09-1015 – Resurfacing Phase II** – [Cicchini] Work is in complete. (3, 5, 8, 13)
- Project #09-1022 – West Frontage Road at CTH K (60th Street)** – [Super Western] Work is complete. (17)
- Project #09-1016 - Resurfacing Phase III** [Cicchini] – Work is complete. (6, 8, 13, 14)
- Project #09-1021 – Reurfacing Phase IV** [Cicchini] – Work is in progress.
