The regular meeting of the Public Works Committee was held on Monday, October 6, 2014 in Room 202 of the Municipal Building. The following members were present: Chairman Eric Haugaard, Vice Chairman Jan Michalski, Aldermen Steve Bostrom, Scott N. Gordon, Rhonda Jenkins, and Patrick Juliana. The meeting was called to order at 5:45pm. Staff members in attendance were Mike Lemens and Shelly Billingsley.

Approval of minutes of regular meeting held on September 15, 2014.

*It was moved by Alderman Jenkins, seconded by Alderman Michalski to approve. Motion passed 6-0.*

1. Approval of request for use of City-Owned Vacant Lot (Harbor Park Parcel A) by Downtown Kenosha, Inc. on October 11, 2014 as part of the Second Saturday events. **(District 2)**

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The property owner located at 1325 56<sup>th</sup> Street is requesting to install their paved parkway. Kenosha Lumber & Mfg. Co, Inc. replaced sections of sidewalk this year and was planning to reinstall the paved parkway until they were notified of the requirement.

The area as shown on the Google Earth maps supplied and the photos supplied by the requester a high majority of the parkway is paved around this business.

**RECOMMENDATION**

Approve the request with the requirement that vehicles can only enter and exit using the driveway approach areas only. This area is located very close to their loading dock and may become a maintenance issue. Based on past practice staff would recommend stamped and colored concrete.












Subject: **Informational Item: School Zone Signage**

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Public Works Engineering Staff has been working on installing 'No Phone Zone' signs at each school in the City of Kenosha since the summer of 2013. In this time, five schools have had the 'No Phone Zone' signs installed around them:

- Edward Bain School of Language and Art (completed July 16, 2014)
- Bose Elementary School (completed September 29, 2014)
- Washington Middle School (completed October 15, 2014)
- Nash Elementary School (completed in 2013)
- Bullen Middle School (completed in 2013)

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Upon reviewing the placement of signs at Nash Elementary and Bullen Middle Schools, a concern was raised that the enforcement of these signs is ambiguous when the existing School Zone signage surrounding these schools is not in compliance with State Statute 118.08 on School Zones or the standards set forth in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). To address this, staff began reviewing the school zone signage around each school in the City of Kenosha to adjust or install additional signage to satisfy State Statutes and MUTCD standards. City staff also began conducting sign inventory of School Zone signs for all schools.

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However, the signage adjustments are time intensive as City Crews are required to remove, relocate, or install up to 30 signs around each school depending on the surrounding roadways. Edward Bain School of Language and Art, Bose Elementary School, and Washington Middle School have had their School Zone signs updated to meet State Statutes while Nash Elementary School and Bullen Middle School only have had 'No Phone Zone' signs installed. Nash and Bullen still require Public Works Engineering Staff to review existing signage and relocate or adjust these signs to satisfy State Statutes, which is staff's next priority.

Public Works Staff has made installing 'No Phone Zone' signs and updating school signage for schools located on City arterial streets their primary focus. All schools requested by alderpersons are put in the queue with work orders that exist for these signs.

The task of installing 'No Phone Zone' signs and the updating of school signage has been absorbed by the City Sign Crew's as part of their daily workloads, which also include the responsibility for pavement markings, the installation of Neighborhood Watch Signs ordered through the Kenosha Police Department, signage installation or removal for Public Safety and Welfare trials, and the annual replacement of approximately ten (10%) percent of city signs to update retro-reflectivity per federal mandates. Through September 30, 2014 City Staff has received requests to install or replace 40 neighborhood watch signs throughout the City of Kenosha. In 2015, City Crews will also be responsible for installing 70 of the large downtown way-finding signs throughout the downtown area. As you know, the project has been out to bid twice without receiving bids, so staff is planning on doing this work 'in house'. In order to complete this extra work, Public Works Administration recommends that additional seasonal staff will need to be hired with the primary task of installing these large downtown signs.

To aid the City Sign Crew in identifying and handling future workloads, Public Works Engineering Staff is compiling a GIS inventory and mapping all city signs. This inventory and map is approximately twenty-five (25%) complete having already taken inventory of 6,116 signs on 3,994 poles. Staff anticipates taking into account approximately 24,000 signs once the inventory is complete. This inventory will aid pinpointing which signs would warrant replacement in the future.
