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KENOSHA-- The Mayor's Youth Commission created an awards program to recognize the community's youth for their outstanding personal achievements and the important, positive contributions they make to the Kenosha community. For the third nomination period of the 2022-23 school year, fifteen students met the criteria to be presented with an award. These students were:

Kenneth Bisher is a senior at Tremper High School. He is an active member at the Church at New Life, a pitcher on the Kenosha Nationals team, and has been involved with the Kenosha Dream Playground Project (Special Inspirational Kids) and with the Kenosha Conservatory of Music (guitar/piano lessons). He is part of the National Honor Society, Tremper Renaissance Program, the Tremper baseball team, band, and yearbook. Kenny is a student that has shown perseverance not only with his academics through COVID by transitioning back to in-person learning, as well as personal struggles he was faced with the loss of a loved family member who he looked up to. His athletic activity was impacted when he tore his meniscus, and he continued to be a role model with all of his activities. He was nominated by school counselor, Brian Schultz.

Annabella Brown is an eighth grader at Lincoln Middle School, nominated by school counselor Sabrina Garner. Annabella has outstanding leadership skills and exhibits integrity in class, clubs, and extracurricular activities. She shows great pride as a member of Student Council and National Honor Society. Her sportsmanship has been represented through being a star member of the girls' basketball team, softball team, and track and field team. In addition, Annabella is a model student. She participates in class discussion, completes her work in a timely manner, and has maintained a 4.0 GPA throughout her three years at Lincoln. She goes above and beyond in her academic achievements.
