## IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF CIVIL WAR MILWAUKEE

Trip #0230336207 \$60 (\$55 FOM) Lunch included  
 Wednesday, May 26 • Depart: 8:30 am – Return: 5 pm  
 Visit two of Milwaukee's ongoing links to the Civil War with Doug Dammann, Curator of the Civil War Museum, and Lance Herdegen, author and history professor at Carroll University. The journey begins with a behind-the-scenes tour of the buildings and grounds of the Milwaukee Soldiers Home. The facility opened shortly after the end of the Civil War due to the work of a group of Milwaukee women who raised over \$77,000 and worked with the federal government to establish the Soldiers Home. Later in the 19th century, other buildings, including a chapel, library, theater and administration building were



constructed. A dozen buildings and several monuments comprise the Milwaukee Soldiers Home Historic District. After lunch at Mader's Restaurant, continue with a guided tour of the Forest Home Cemetery. Established in 1850, Forest Home Cemetery is the final resting place for many of the original founders of Milwaukee including several who served during the Civil War.

## MILWAUKEE HIGHLIGHTS

 Enjoy a delightful day visiting two of Milwaukee's newest museums: the Harley-Davidson Museum and the Grohmann Museum at the Milwaukee School of Engineering. The Harley-Davidson Museum features fascinating interactive exhibits that explore the history of this motorcycle from WWI to the present. Discover how motorcycles are designed and assembled. Then you are off to lunch aboard the Edelweiss for a 90-minute luncheon cruise through Milwaukee's architectural jungle. After lunch, visit the Grohmann Museum at the MSOE. This intriguing museum is home to more than 800 paintings and sculptures from 1850 to the present focusing on the evolution of human work displayed on three gallery floors. The museum also has a spectacular rooftop sculpture garden.



## CHICAGO ARTS: CHICAGO THEATRE AND THE ART INSTITUTE

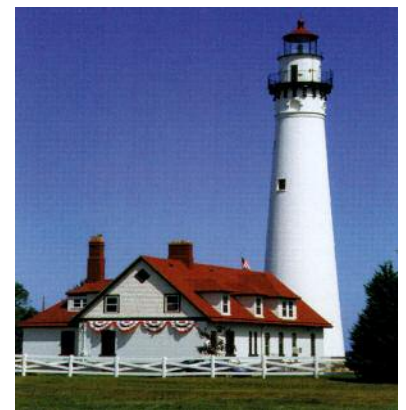

 This is a unique experience to visit southeast Wisconsin lighthouses with, literally, the people who wrote the book! Join Barb and Ken Wardius, authors of three books on Wisconsin lighthouses, for a daylong tour highlighting southeastern Wisconsin's historical beacons. Included are the Kenosha, Racine, Milwaukee and Port Washington lights. Discover the individual histories, characteristics, personalities, and essence of these maritime treasures. For those who wish to climb, the towers of Southport Kenosha; Wind Point Racine; North Point Milwaukee and the Old Port Washington lighthouses will be open for your enjoyment. Preservation efforts at these four renovated sites will also be featured. Bring a camera and good walking shoes. A picnic box lunch is included.

## CRUISING CHICAGO

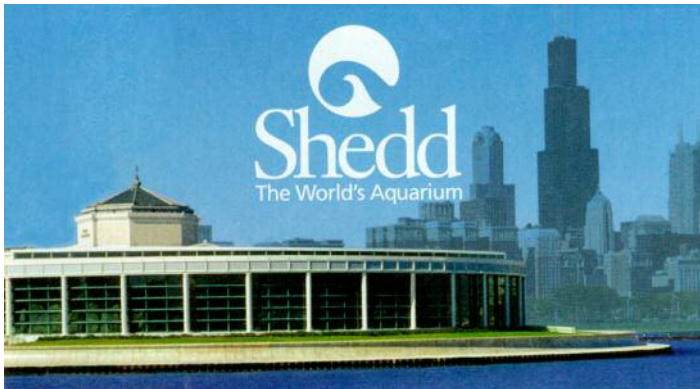
Trip #0220186307 \$65 (\$60 FOM) Lunch on your own

Come eye to eye with a dolphin; visit the ecosystem of the beluga whales; and see a host of fishes and invertebrates that make their homes where freshwater flows into the ocean or where tides turn seascapes to landscapes in the Oceanarium. Witness the amazing natural talents as dolphins soar, belugas dance, and penguins parade in *Fantasea*, the new aquatic show. Get a diver's view of sharks, corals, fish and eels in the Wild Reef. A wonderful watery adventure awaits you! Lunch is on your own at the Bubble Net food court at the Aquarium.
