Anyone who can wield a needle and thread can make needlelace. Using simple stitches, students complete a small motif suitable for a brooch, applique or to enclose in a paperweight or small frame. Students should bring a pincushion with several straight pins, a sewing needle, scissors and a thimble, if accustomed to using one. Pattern, tapestry needle and thread will be provided by the instructor. Patterns will be provided for a variety of thread sizes depending on the comfort level of the student.

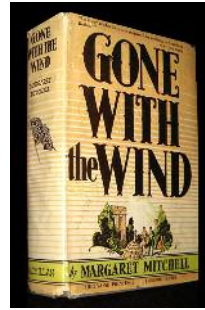

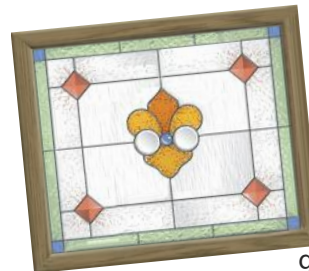

Teaching watercolor workshops for over 30 years, all over the USA and Canada, Joseph Fettingis has learned what the needs of the student are. The workshop includes 5-6 group demonstrations but the bulk of the workshop focuses on working "one-on-one" with each student. Learn to control moisture in 3 levels. Focus on how colors work, how to move the colors without guessing, and composing and designing your watercolor painting. Learn how to compose negative and positive areas and how to move your values and colors before you paint. The goal of Mr. Fettingis' workshops has always been "each student, no matter what level they are in, needs to go home with more knowledge than when they came in....then my job was done" and we both will go home happy!

Mr. Fettingis is a signature member of the National Watercolor Society and has been published in *American Artist* magazine, as well as *Palette Talk*, and *International Artist* magazines. He has been featured in the books *Splash 6*, *Painting Color*, and *Best of Watercolors 2* as well as many newspaper articles throughout the US, Canada and Puerto Rico.
